Each of these orders has its own criteria for eligibility, but knighthood is generally granted by a head of state or monarch or prelate to selected persons to recognise some meritorious achievement, as in the British honours system often for service to the Church or country. A narrowing of the generic meaning "servant" to "military follower of a king or other superior" is visible today. During this time the knight continued training in combat and were allowed to own armour rather than borrowing it.
